THE IRISH CAUSE.

Enthusiastic Meeting of

Leaguers in Chicago

A SPEECH ADDRESS TO THE PUBLIC.

The Land League Convention Postponed

Until January, 1886.

CHICAGO, Aug. 15.—Delegates representing

the Irish National League of nearly

seventy states in the United States, held a

sectional meeting at the Hotel Hamilton

to-day, for the purpose of discussing

the best means of raising money for the

Irish National League, and of electing

representatives to the national convention

to be held in London in the month of

January, 1886. The meeting was

attended by about 100 delegates, and

was presided over by Mr. J. J. Devine,

of New York. The first business was

the reading of a report from the

executive committee, which was

approved. The next order of business

was the election of delegates to the

national convention. The delegates

were elected by ballot, and the result

was as follows: New York, 10; New
