WOMAN KILLED

Husband of Injured Woman, the Well Known Park Commissioner, Will Make No Admissions INSISTS INJURY WAS ACCIDENTAL

This morning a report came from Santa Monica to the effect that Col. Governor of Colorado Decides to Send Militia to Cripple Creek to Cope With Strikers

SHERIFF OPPOSED THE STEP

DENVER, Colo., Sept. 4.—Governor Peabody decided last night to send the militia to Cripple Creek to investigate the strike conditions there, to dispatch troops to the gold camp. Orders were given to the militia to proceed at once. The militia is composed of the First regiment of infantry, company H of the Second regiment of infantry, the First squadron of cavalry, consisting of troops I, D and C, battery A and the First regiment of artillery, and the national guard of the Colorado militia.

Troops were asked for by the Mine Owners' association, but Sheriff Roberson of Teller county said that he saw no necessity for calling out the militia. No violence has been reported at Cripple Creek since Tuesday night, when one non-union carpenter and a lone miner were assaulted by unknown persons.

President Charles H. Moyer of the Western Federation of Miners addressed a letter to Governor Peabody, in which he declared that the conditions at Cripple Creek district are not such as to warrant the calling out of the militia. He stated that the militia is not needed at this time as a violation of the law under which the strike is being conducted.
