MRS. CRIFFITH'S STATEMENT TO HER SISTER

"Griffith had been unusually pleasant for the last two days. We had just walked down to the bath ho ise and were planing to come back to Les Angeles. Griffith told me to go back to the hotel and pack the trunk as he was going to call at the Wiley Wells' house. I had packed the trunk when he opened the door, drew a revolver, cocked it and polating it at my head, said.

"Cover your eyes. Take your prays book. I'm go ag to shoot you." I' said, Why, Papa, what do you mean? Why, Griffith!!"

"He then deliberately fired at me. I ran to him and struggled with him, imploring him for mercy. In desperation I jumped out of the window."

Colonel Griffith's Story

HIS is the story of the shooting as told by Colonel Griffith: "This thing has completely unnerved ma. You know how those accidents, for there can be no question this was an accident, come upon one all unawares, and one never knows how it happened. It just comes somehow, and you have no warning and no chance to prepare for it. This is how my wife was shot: We were getting ready to return to Loc Angeles and my wife and I arranged to get our things packed that night ready to leave for the city Friday morning. I was bending over my suit case laying some of my belongings into it, when I was startled by a report and turned to see my wife fall to the floor. She was unconscious and did not answer me as I called to know if she was hurt. The blood was streaming from her left eyebrow, and I saw I must summon help at once. The wound did not look like a serious one. It seemed as though the bullet had struck a glancing blow. In fact it amounts to nothing at all.

Well-Known Capitalist Positively Denies Having Attacked His Wife and Saus It Was All an Accident

YING upon a cot in the California hospital, the wife of Colonel Griffith J. Griffith is making a brave fight for life. The physicians say her condition is most critical. An ugly wound in the patient's head tells the story of an awful tragedy enacted in the Arcadia hotel in Santa Monica, Thursday evening.

Because he disagreed with his wife in religious matters, Colonel Griffith, according to the woman's own statement, made a target of her, after first commanding her to kneel and get her prayer book. In her frantic endeavor to get away, Mrs. Griffith leaped through the open window and struck on the roof of a wooden porch, two stories below. Thence she crawled to a window and was rescued by hotel attaches.

The story of the tragedy as told by Griffith himself is that his wife accidentally shot herself while packing up. Another story that was current at the hotel was that Mrs. Griffith had attempted to take her own life.

Four days before the wedding day, it is said, Griffith served notice on his bride that unless she deeded all of her property to him forthwith, he would refuse to make her his wife. The property, consisting of the Briswalter tract, valued at \$500,000, was promptly placed in Griffith's name and after the ceremony Griffith is shid to have made the remark that he had made good his boast that "he would never marry a woman without money or aronerty."
