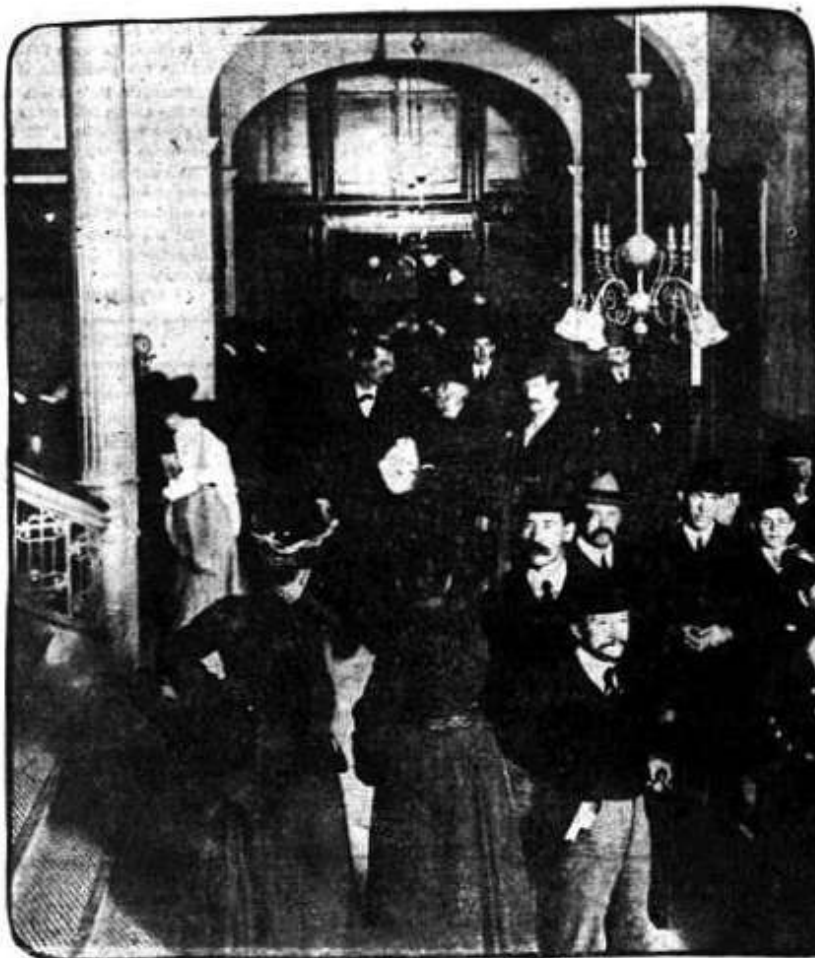

EMINENT LAWYERS MAKE JURY PLEAS
