## I. Circle of Fifths

1. Diatonic circle of fifths in major with root position triads
2. Diatonic circle of fifths in major alternating triads and first inversion chords

3. Diatonic circle of fifths in minor with root position triads
4. Diatonic circle of fifths in minor alternating triads and first inversion chords


Use natural minor with a harmonic minor cadence.
5. Diatonic sequence: The 7th as a passing note
6. Diatonic sequence: $\mathbf{7}$ to $\mathbf{7}$ combination

7. Diatonic sequence: 7 to $4 / 3$ combination
8. Diatonic sequence: 7 to $6 / 5$ combination

9. Diatonic sequence: $6 / 5$ to 2 combination
10. Diatonic sequence: $6 / 5$ to root combination


## II. Falling $4^{\text {th }}$ pairs, descending

11. Falling $4^{\text {th }}$ : Root position, major
12. Falling $4^{\text {th }}$ : Root position to first inversion, major

III. Falling $3^{\text {rd }}$ pairs, ascending
13. Falling $3^{\text {rd }}$ : Root position


## IV. Nonfunctional parallel movement

14. Parallel first inversion chords, major
15. Parallel first inversion chords with suspensions, minor
