## Argumentative essay: Stage directions

## **Solution**

Commas that do not conform to the rules for comma placement are highlighted.

Looking at famous plays, such as "Death of a Salesman" by Arthur Miller, it becomes clear, that the playwriter included many stage directions in his play. Now the question is, if these stage directions are important for the readers or, if they should be left out.

Moreover, stage directions are often very specific, for instance, the Latin word "exeunt" is used, if more actors or actresses leave the stage. That is why stage directions are hard to understand and might confuse the reader.

However, there are also advocates, who praise the fact, that due to stage directions the reader gets to know what the characters, their gesture, and mimic look like.
