A corpus shows you words and phrases from many different situations. Take a look at these example sentences from the English Web 2018 corpus. **Highlight** information you get on the starting point, the destination, and the time.



Do you notice a pattern? Describe the pattern. Work with a partner.



For corpus experts: You can work with these concordances <u>or</u> with SkeLL again. Go back to the examples and look for expressions describing the starting point, the destination, and the time. Create a word cloud.

8	I even rode a	bike	to work today.
9	Yet another option: take a	bus	from the train station (Santa Maria Novella) to the airport.
10	I suggest you call a	cab	to take you home.
11	At about three p.m. we boarded our	train	to Fairbanks.
