
The following steps will guide you through the interface of Sketch Engine step by step. Let's get started!



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Step 6) Now click on the shared corpus "Social English for Medical Context".

Step 7) Click on "Concordance".



Step 8) Click on the tab "ADVANCED" and type the word "help" into the search field.




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

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Step 9) Now select the filter "Lemma context" and type in the word "not".

Press the red go-button!



Now you should be able to see all of the concordance lines (total of 160).



Assignments:

- Take a look at the lines and select the ones where *help* is used in a different way than offering help or asking for it. You can **tick the boxes** to mark the lines.
- Once you finished looking through all of the pages, you can look at your selection by clicking on the blue button "SELECTED" at the bottom of the page.
- Examine your selection closely. Think about how *help* in this context is different from the context of asking for help or offering it. Take notes.

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
