Patient Education: Prostate Exam

- A prostate exam is done help diagnose an enlarged or inflamed prostate. The exam typically
 involves a digital rectal examination and a blood test that measures prostate-specific antigen
 levels.
- You might feel discomfort or the need to urinate during the digital rectal examination, but it should resolve when the examination is done. If you continue to feel discomfort, you can take an oral analgesic (such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen) as directed by your healthcare provider.
