

Quick Reference APA Style Citations

Each cited reference entry should be double spaced with the first line flush with the left margin. Entries that run more than one line should have the subsequent line or lines indented ½ inch (“hanging indent”). Arrange entries in alphabetical order by the surname of the first author. If you cannot find some of the required information, or it is non-applicable, do not include it in your citation. All titles should be in sentence case, except for journal titles.

Do not include personal communications or any other source that is not retrievable by others. Instead, cite these sources in the body of your paper.
